	Cllr Pickard welcomed attendees to the meeting.
2.	<b>Minutes of the last meeting</b>
	The minutes of the meeting on 7 September 2017 were agreed and an update on actions provided.  Thanks and praise were given to Amy Buxton-Jennings, Director of Commissioning & Improvement, Lambeth Council/NHS Lambeth CCG who has now left the organisation for her hard work and commitment to the board.
3.	<b>GSTC Childhood Obesity Programme</b>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sarah Hickey, Head of Strategy, Guys and St Thomas's Chariy, GSTC</li> </ul> <p><i>Sarah Hickey</i> introduced her presentation about the GSTC Childhood Obesity programme providing background information to its origins. It was explained that the charity works with a range of partners in Lambeth and Southwark to identify, test and scale new approaches.</p> <p>Key aspects of the programme:</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10 year programme goal - Contribute to tackling the obesity deprivation gap in the boroughs</li> <li>• The programme model works at three levels – concentrating at neighbourhood, tackling systemic barriers at borough level; engaging and influencing in societal level barriers outside the boroughs</li> <li>• 2017 focus: what would communities like to do; what works in different spaces; Around which geographic boundaries should we focus; how do we coordinate activity</li> <li>• Next steps:</li> <li>• Publishing insights from work so far (January)</li> <li>• Develop the programme design and plan, based on insights from the Develop phase</li> <li>• Develop pipeline of partnerships and projects</li> <li>• Start implementation of the programme plan (early 2018)</li> <li>• We anticipate a focus on neighbourhood- and borough level activity in the first few years, building to wider influencing activity beyond later in the programme</li> <li>• The presentation posed a question for discussion: <i>How can GSTC’s childhood obesity programme ensure continued alignment to local system aims in Lambeth?</i></li> </ul> <p><b>Comments and discussion:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There was a discussion about focusing on particular neighbourhood areas</li> <li>• Reference was made to the CYPP campaign work</li> <li>• The interrelationship between healthy eating and behaviour was discussed – environmental factors impact on healthy choices was highlighted</li> <li>• School nursing perspective around barriers to healthy eating was discussed – Dr Bidisha Lahoti at Evelina agreed to facilitate a focus group to discuss further</li> <li>• Learning disabilities links to obesity is a local issue</li> <li>• Ethnographic data collection and sampling methods by age, ethnicity, socio-economic factors</li> <li>• Programme to meet with Lambeth Early Action Partnership (LEAP) to identify any overlap</li> <li>• Southwark is working with Alexandra Rose Charities</li> <li>• Concern that early help interventions aren’t flexible enough</li> <li>• GPs requested a referral form to help engage GPs</li> </ul>

Budget mapping has taken place, further detail around governance is now included in the plan.</p> <p>The final CYPP will go to the CCG governing body for approval today and Cabinet in January. New Early Help Offer to be operational by April 2018.</p> <p><b>Comments and discussion:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A new early help offer to include: Tier 2 advice and support: for children, young people and families with “emerging needs” provided, in the main, by universal or targeted services and the wider community, including schools, children’s centres, youth and play providers, school nursing, sexual health and substance misuse services and Tier 3 targeted family support: for families with multiple needs (Tier 3) provided by the local authority</li> <li>• Concern around Troubled/Aspirational Families programme performance</li> <li>• Discussions taking place between now and February are key to shaping Early Help service delivery</li> <li>• Issue around identifying cohorts as different Early Help offers are being provided in different areas</li> <li>• Lack of data for families referred to Troubled Families programme by children’s centres</li> <li>• Police provided example case study of recent missing teenager and services engaged</li> <li>• Impact on school exclusions – to be scheduled as a future agenda item</li> <li>• Whole system approach is key</li> <li>• MS to produce a 2 page briefing - regarding Early Help commissioning provision and restructure (in absence of commissioning at the meeting)</li> </ul>
