3.	Children Social Care Improvement Plan (Presentation by Rebecca Eligon)		
3.1	<p>An update was provided to the group following the Inadequate Ofsted rating in May 2015 and what we are doing to improve the service:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Morning Lane Associates were appointed by DfE as the council's improvement advisor An Improvement Plan was agreed in December 2015 and an Improvement Team was established by the council in January 2016 and we received our notice to improve. Feedback in June from the DfE was that they were broadly supportive of our revised Improvement strategy Ofsted have undertaken 4 visits of the authority, three of which were voluntary and one (in late July) which was a formal monitoring visit The report on the latter has been published In summary, the letter observes that "the local authority is making some progress to improve services for children and young people, but the pace of change continues to be slow". The inspectors noted that Lambeth has a realistic understanding of the challenges facing Children's Services and are taking action to address the significant weaknesses identified. However, they conclude that many improvement measures are not yet in place or have been too recent to make a difference. Therefore, Ofsted advise that the changes required need to accelerate considerably to sufficiently support and safeguard vulnerable children from harm. Ofsted will undertake a further monitoring visit in November which will influence their decision as to whether they undertaken a full inspection (likely to be in the first six months of 2017). Ofsted are interested in 'live' practice now <p>What we have done:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete restructure of Children Social Care. We now have small teams of 6 social workers, a dedicated business support officer and a team manager. We have brought in more senior-level capacity, including an experienced interim Director of Children Services, permanent senior staff including Director of Children's Social Care and Assistant Directors. There is a new independent Chair of LSCB. A new 'standalone' Children's Services Directorate has been created Thresholds have been revised and re-launched and addressing systems and processes and establishing new practice standards Ofsted are expecting things to change very quickly AE asked about communication with front line practitioners. Rebecca Eligon reported that a range of initiatives are now in place to communicate with front line practitioners, including staff events, weekly email updates and a monthly newsletter. Cllr JP asked what was being done to stabilise and motivate the workforce. RE stated that there is an extensive and exciting training programme for staff, staff conferences are being arranged in attractive venues, and there is increasing stability in senior management

4.1	<p>AE provided the group with the following update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The vision of the programme is that all young people in Lambeth and Southwark will have safe, effective everyday healthcare as part of a world class health system It is a young people-friendly standard which is more accessible to young people. It was pioneered at the Well Centre. CYPHP new website just launched – www.cyphp.org <p>CYPHP Outcomes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improve everyday health for all children by working on quality and bringing together partners in a stronger system dedicated to children and young people's health, for instance through key providers sharing records Bring more healthcare into the community, run from GP surgeries and other community locations rather than hospital Promote Emotional Health and Wellbeing in schools Create new models of healthcare for teenagers and older children (that is age appropriate) Work from a strong academic evidence base Build in Evaluation <p>What's changing and different?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have money now to implement it The work started in North Lambeth with joint clinics with GP's and Paediatricians (6-8 months), is now working north of Southwark then South East of the borough The possibility of enabling service users to book into one portal is being looked at, service users should be able to book into clinics through this system 10% wheeze/respiratory issues don't need to come to A&E. We are appointing 2 Community Asthma nurses for Lambeth. Currently we have one. We are upskilling GP's to do asthma care plans (approx. 2,500 plans) Second aim would be to tackle Epilepsy in the community For schools there is work being done on the emotional resilience programme. A provider to be selected in September and training rolled out in October There is investment for a Looked After Nurse for out of borough placements. This is currently being tested and modelled <p>CYPHP Legacy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children will be healthier Frontline staff will work more 'smartly' Providers can manage increasing demand Commissioners will have evidence for value based commissioning There will be a children's health system that is constantly learning Lambeth will have contributed a rigorously evaluated model of care, informing national

CD to pass onto Duncan at Dunraven school • AM is putting together a briefing to introduce the session. SA will also be covering the session

7.	Partner updates including report on impact of austerity		
7.1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RE – In our school, austerity not had a massive impact, we are financially stable. Had to maintain good quality of staff • CD – Effects of benefits cap. Families have been re-housed further out of the borough but still travel in from distances as they do not want to lose their school places. “Temporary” accommodation can mean as much as 5 years. The Fairer Funding Formula - Inner London schools are facing 19% cut: for our school would mean £400,000 out of a £1m budget. We are not replacing staff who are leaving. Proposed cuts for 2-3 years, early years funding. • NM – GP’s had something similar to the Fairer Funding Formula for 10 years and then it got removed. NM informed the group that there has been CCG funding for GAIA centre for special early intervention team for ages 12-17 years, dealing with child exploitation and child abuse. We are funding Mosaic Clubhouse for a young people’s project for 16-25 year olds to look at things like CV writing, transition services, apprentice training • PC – There is a new 19yrs+ loan. Loan repayments are done according to age. The college has a £6m deficit and is in a difficult position. There are cuts on support services and no staff are being replaced. Colleges are merging. • SP – Some voluntary organisations are looking at merging or being taken over. Same issues about families being housed far out of the borough. • LM – LEAP are funded by the Big Lottery, £36m for £10 years. We are currently in Year 2. • MM – There is a year on year grant reduction. Some services will be reduced. Vulnerable people will be protected.
