

Privacy Notice – Project Smith – Community Connectors

Project Smith is a community development project and Community Connectors are part of the project.

Community Connectors are individuals that link people in their local community with activities and organisations that can help improve their quality of life. After an initial four-day training programme, Connectors are supported in monthly ‘safari’ supervisions hosted by different health and care services. Community Connectors can help with suggestions for local help and support, activities you might be interested in, or have a helpful chat.

If you consent, Lambeth Council and CCG will keep identifiable data on you relating to your participation in Project Smith. This data will be used to evaluate the effectiveness of Project Smith. You would participate either as a Community Connector, or as someone who has been in touch with a Community Connector. You will be consenting to share your name and contact information, and the outcome of the connection made. This information will be consolidated and become part of an evaluation of Project Smith, carried out by New Economics Foundation (NEF) Consulting.

People who have access to your information will only normally have access to that which they need to fulfil their roles.

You have the right to object to our sharing your data in these circumstances but we have an overriding responsibility to comply with our legal obligations. Please see below.

We are required by Articles in the General Data Protection Regulations to provide you with the information in the following 9 subsections.

6) Rights to object	You have the right to object to some or all the information being processed under Article 21.
